

TEESSIDE. (cont'd) 11th Oct. 1968 signed

For the display and air races here on the 11th of October the weather despite a fine Saturday, turned foul cutting visibility down to no more than a few metres at times. Despite this a varied selection of aircraft were present for what part of the display that took place.

The flying was opened by Aiglet G-ANWV demonstrating the capabilities of this type in the aerobatic role and was quickly followed by aerobatics as performed by a T53B, o/n TY21, this is one that has been modified by the manufacturers and is now used as a demonstrator. The racers G-AWHV, G-AWHW and G-ATLY all Beta's and G-AXEA a Cassair then took to the air to race round the airfield for 10 laps. The race proved interesting with Beta's changing place regularly so regularly that the Editor lost count of who was on what lap. After these nidgets the next participant appeared huge, for a Boeing 707 of BHA, G-AYEU flew in carrying a number of company employees. After one low run over the airfield the 707 landed in the thickening mist. After this point the weather began closing in and what aircraft that were seen flying were only viewed with difficulty, for example Hercules XV298 did fly but on one of the fly-pasts down the runway it remained hidden to the crowd. Other incidents similar to this one took place, a Gnat flew straight down the runway at low altitude going so fast that it lost the airport thereafter.

During the afternoon the weather did lift sufficiently to allow Sq. Ldr. Hanna to demonstrate the abilities of Spitfire MH434 (G-ASJV) to some effect, but after that the mist came down again.

Apart from the aforementioned the following were seen during the day, Comet G-APDB, Airedale G-AWSA, Tiger Moth G-ANED, SIAI SF 260 G-AXAH, Cessna I72 G-AWJS, Cherokee G-ASLV, Haladou G-AVHJ, Twin Comanche G-ASOB, Cherokee G-ATTF, Cherokee G-ATJE, and joy ride aircraft Twin Comanche G-AXDL, Aztec G-AWIK, Islanders G-AXFL and G-AXHV. On the military side the Patrouille De France were present with Majisters 534/3, 535/4, 536/5, 546/6, 544/7, 54E/8, 542/9, 545/10, 562/12, and 576/14 also Noratlas No. 6 coded 'BJ'. Of the RAF besides the Hercules and unidentified Gnat only Jet Provosts XS5182/55, XR651/53 and XP564/61 of 3 FTS were present.

NEWS.

On the 17th. Sept. a Jet Provost T5 from Linton on Ouse crashed at Kiplingcoates in the East Riding. The aircraft is a write off but fortunately the pilot, a student, was able to eject safely.

On 17th. October a sailplane flying from Sutton Bank made a sudden dive and was unable to recover sufficient height to reach the landing strip and was forced to land on the hillside. Although the glider was destroyed the pilot escaped serious injury.

Still on the subject of bending aeroplanes Humber Airways Islander G-AXRM is now flying with a replacement wing tip and nose which must have been damaged some time recently.

At Leeming new Jet Provost T5's to arrive are XW316 and 317 coded 32 and 33 respectively. Also at Leeming XR670 and 672 are now with 3FTS coded 63 and 48 respectively.

Arrivals at Leeds by road have been Pup G-AXEW on 15/9 and Cessna I72 G-AYCT on 6/10 both for Y.L.A.

At Sherburn Tiger Moth G-AIRI arrived on 27/9 to be based.

During September Lightning F6 XS894 crashed about 5 miles off Flamborough Head. The american pilot was unfortunately killed.
